Year 5 Theatre Trip: 101 Dalmatians

We are pleased to inform you that we are taking all of our Year 5 pupils to see the performance of 101 Dalmatians at The Repertory Theatre in Birmingham on Wednesday 6th December 2017.

The school will cover the cost of this trip, as it is a visit linked to the English curriculum. We will leave school at around 1pm, travelling by coach. We ex-

pect to return to school at around 6pm – although please note that the theatre staff are not able to confirm an exact running time of the performance yet. As soon as I have this information, I will be able to confirm the approximate time at which we expect to return to school and will share this information with parents, via The Insider.

School uniform will be worn for the visit and a packed lunch will need to be provided, to be eaten in school prior to departure (pupils entitled to Free School Meals will be able to order their packed lunch in advance). Pupils should bring a bottle of water with them to drink and a snack to be eaten in the interval – due to the size of our year group, pupils will not be able to purchase snacks at the theatre. 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
