Advent (the season of preparation before Christmas) officially began last Sunday, although those who have an Advent calendar would have started on Saturday, I suspect. At school, we have our own Advent calendar, where some of our Year 5 pupils come down each day when they do not have assembly. We open up a window as it tells the Christmas story, and have a prayer before sharing some chocolate! As we get closer to Christmas, more of the nativity story is uncovered.

Year 5 are also looking at Advent in their Spiritual and Social Education lessons. The Advent wreath is made up of four coloured candles, standing for peace, love, joy and hope. There is a white candle that is lit at Christmas-time, with the third candle being pink while the others are purple.



A dozen of our pupils have helped shape a questionnaire that will be used by social care staff. The project lead for the Worcestershire Safeguarding Children Board worked with the pupils to see if the resources that adults had prepared were as useful as they could be. The atmosphere within the room was positive throughout, and the feedback offered by pupils was really helpful. I am grateful for their input.



Just a reminder that we are taking all of our Year 5 pupils to see the performance of *The Wizard of Oz* at the Birmingham Repertory Theatre on Wednesday 12th December 2018.

As the trip is linked to the English curriculum, the school will cover the cost. We will leave school at around 9am, travelling by coach. Any pupils who arrive late on the day will not be able to attend the trip, so please ensure punctuality. We expect to return to school at around 2pm, at which time the pupils will eat their lunch. School uniform will be worn for the visit and a packed lunch will need to be provided (pupils entitled to Free School Meals will order their packed lunch in advance). Pupils should bring a bottle of water with them to drink and a snack to be eaten in the interval; it is a good idea for them to have two snacks with them, so that they can eat one at around 10am when we arrive at the theatre, and then their second snack during the interval. Please bear in mind our school policy regarding nuts. Due to the size of our year group, pupils will not be able to purchase snacks at the theatre.

Christmas Lunch 2018

Christmas lunches this year will be held on Wednesday 19th and Thursday 20th December 2018. If your child wishes to have a Christmas lunch, the cost will be £3.00, to be paid via Parentpay.

Abberley and Bredon Colleges will have their Christmas lunches on Wednesday 19th December, while Cleeve and Malvern College lunches will be on the following day. **There will be no other catering available on these days**, so pupils who do not wish to have a Christmas lunch will need to bring in a packed meal from home; equally the children in the colleges not having Christmas lunch will need to bring in a packed lunch as no other meals will be available. Those who take free school lunches will be provided with their meal.

Please note that when paying by Parentpay, the Christmas lunch option will be listed as a separate item so that we can identify the number of meals required. Please select the Christmas lunch item (log in to Parentpay, then go into 'pay for other items') and ensure that you make your payment by 17th December 2018. If you are unable to pay by Parentpay, please put £3 in an envelope clearly marked with your child's name and tutor group and put it in the drop box. Please ensure that your child does not put their £3 in the cashloader as this method is only to be used for everyday school meals.

Please note, **no tuck** will be available on Wednesday 19th & Thursday 20th December.

This week's Word of the Week:



Show your tutor your notes on Word of the Week and receive a merit for answering the questions above!


