



Teaching Groups and Sets for 2018/19

Pupils attend the majority of their lessons in teaching groups. Teaching groups are mixed ability. Sets for Maths, English and Science are organised according to teacher recommendations and analysis of pupils' performance during the last academic year. Pupils are placed in sets with others currently working at a similar ability stage to them. There may be movement between sets over the course of the year.

Teaching Groups

These have been arranged as follows:




Year 6 will be taught in seven teaching groups. As they have been taught in seven teaching groups this year, there has been no need for us to change the groups completely, although slight changes may have been made.

Year 7 and 8 will be taught in six teaching groups. As they have been taught in seven teaching groups this year, we have reorganised the pupils into new groups.

English Groups

English groups have been arranged as follows:



Year 6 will be split into two halves (c and e) and each side of the year will be taught in four ability groups, sets 1 to 4.

In both Years 7 and 8 pupils will be taught in seven ability sets, 1-7.

Maths Sets

Maths groups have been arranged as follows:

Year 5 will be split into two halves (c and e) and until approximately half term they will be taught in their six mixed ability teaching groups. We will then use teacher assessment data to organise them into four ability sets on each half of the year.

Year 6 will be split into two halves (c and e) and each side of the year will be taught in four ability groups, sets 1 to 4.

In both Years 7 and 8 pupils will be taught in seven ability sets, 1-7.

Science Groups

Science groups have been arranged as follows:

Year 5 will be split into two halves (c and e) and until approximately half term they will be taught in their six mixed ability teaching groups. We will then use teacher assessment data to organise them into three ability sets on each half of the year.

Year 6 will be split into two halves (c and e). On the C side of the year they will be taught in four sets, 1 to 4; on the E side of the year they will be taught in 3 sets, 1-3.

Year 7 and 8 will be split into two halves (c and e) and each side of the year will be taught in ability sets 1-3.







Year 6 Cricket:

Redditch Champions!

What a season it has been for the Year 6 Cricket Team! The boys sailed through the group stages, topping their pool following comfortable wins against Birchensale and Woodfield. Ridgeway were Walkwood's semi-final opponents and, again, Walkwood were convincing victors.

That set up a Walkwood verses Birchensale Final on Tuesday 10th



July. This promised to be a competitive spectacle with both teams having beaten each other once this season. Walkwood were put into bat first and started well with opening batsman Owen Rae finding several boundaries. The middle order continued to build the runs with Toby Clements, Tom Scott, Fin Baker, Ellis Browning and Kurtis West batting sensibly. The final pair of Henry Gibson and Sam Blackburn increased the rate with four fine overs to bring Walkwood to a closing total of 269. Although a very competitive total, Walkwood knew that they would have to bowl and field well to restrict Birchensale.

Birchensale started well with their opening batsman playing sensibly and Walkwood failing to take a wicket in the first five overs. However, the introduction of bowlers Henry Gibson and Sam Blackburn brought the breakthrough with Henry taking one wicket for 8 runs and Sam two wickets for 17 runs. As a result, Birchensale were 42 runs adrift with only four overs to play. The final was far from won, however, with Birchensale's captain and best player hitting 22 runs from the his first over leaving our opponents requiring 20 runs from the last three overs. Owen Rae produced a superb over, only conceding two runs. Having been hit for several boundaries in his previous over, Ellis Browning bowled his final over. The impressive Birchensale batsman again found several boundaries and put the pressure onto Walkwood. Undeterred, Ellis showed tremendous courage and skill to take a wicket with his final delivery! A real demonstration of outstanding character for a pupil playing a year above himself. Still, the trophy was far from won with Birchensale requiring 13 from the last six balls. Up steps the talented Owen Rae ... dot ball. Great start. Then a 'two' followed by a 'six'! Despair! Birchensale require five off the last three balls ... their star player is at the crease and the other Birchensale players are starting to celebrate. Unflappable, Owen Rae delivers ... wicket ... bowled! Incredible! Pure emotion! Everyone calms down and regains focus knowing that with two deliveries left the game is still undecided ... another great delivery ... Birchensale play it and go for the run ... great fielding from the rejuvenated Walkwood results in a run out to seal certain victory! Walkwood are crowned district champions!

A truly fantastic game of cricket with a finish that was fitting of the occasion! Mr Walsh was incredibly proud of all of the team and could not have asked for a better way to close his Walkwood sporting memories. A special mention to Henry Gibson, who not only played fantastically in his final Walkwood fixture but has also been an inspirational captain and leader to this cricket team.




