Dear Parents and Carers,

There have been two visitors of note this week (not that any of you who have dropped in are not important too!). On Tuesday, Redditch County's MP, Rachel Maclean, was toured around the school by our Head Boy, Daniel Wild, and Head Girl, Lily-Mae Lev. Mrs Maclean talked with them as they explained the sort of school we are while visiting some classes. I also had the opportunity to talk to our MP about Walkwood's recent past, and she was keen to know about our place within the 2 and 3 tier debate. She also asked me about the funding situation, and I know she is keen to press Redditch's case in Parliament.

Wednesday brought the Regional Schools Commissioner, Christine Quinn, to the school. She too had time with pupils, including Daniel and Lily-Mae, as I feel that it is important for visitors see us as we are, and hear from the pupils themselves whose school it is anyway! Ms Quinn was also very taken indeed with what she saw and heard. With a member of the Education team from the Diocese of Worcester, Ms Quinn and I then talked about Walkwood, the current educational situation in Redditch, and also about the future of this school. I believe that Walkwood Church of England Middle School has a substantial future, not that there won't be challenges, big or small, of which funding will be one of the former, as it is nationally. We are set to benefit from the forthcoming National Funding Formula.



Also this week, The Parliamentary Review has been launched, and our school is featured in the important publication. The Parliamentary Review's September release is a key fixture in the political calendar. Walkwood features alongside the Prime Minister and a small number of outstanding

schools in a document that looks back on the year in schools and Westminster. The main aim of the Review is to showcase best practice as a learning tool to the public and private sector. 


