Year 8 Rugby v Tudor Grange Academy [Worcs] - 31/01/18

The Year 8 Rugby Team took on Tudor Grange in Phase 2 of the County Rugby Tournament on Wednesday 31st January. This match was played in challenging conditions due to all the recent rainfall. It was also very cold on our field!

Tudor Grange started strongly, retaining possession with some good rucking and strong running by their forwards. By the time the Walkwood players had woken up we were three tries down!

However, Walkwood began to tackle and turn over the ball at breakdown, finally being able to show their attacking skills. Good interplay between forwards and backs resulted in our first try. Another two tries by the visitors followed resulting in a half time score of Walkwood 5-25 Tudor Grange.

Playing down the hill after the interval, the Walkwood lads showed a big improvement in terms of intensity, support play and courage when tackling. They began to dominate both territory and possession, scoring four quick tries to bring the scores level. Credit to Tudor Grange for scoring a great length of the field try to put them 30-25 ahead with 5 minutes to play. Despite wave after wave of attacking pressure we just could not get over the opposition try line and the final whistle blew.
