This week saw pupils trying to impress during the interview stage of the process. Following receiving **328** letters of application, pupils were shortlisted for the interviews. In total, **157** pupils were interviewed this week for one of the **50** job roles up for grabs.



Many pupils came to school 'dressed to impress' and really did impress. It was great to see the continuing buzz around school regarding this event with many pupils helping each other with their interview techniques and preparations.

To help support the pupils, all year groups have been receiving lessons in the last week or so on interview techniques and mock interviews. We have been so impressed by the standard of the answers given and the pupil's professionalism at interviews this week, with some incredibly thoughtful and concise responses to some very tricky questions. All pupils should be exceptionally proud of themselves... we certainly are!

Staff really are having a tough time deciding on who will be awarded the role. In fact, the phrase "can we have all of them" has been used quite frequently by staff this week, to which I have had to reply "unfortunately not".

Pupils will receive a letter during the earlier stages of next week to inform them as to whether they have secured the role or not. The letter will also detail what happens next with regards to them preparing for the day, planning lessons etc. where needed.

Once again we congratulate all pupils who have taken part in the Takeover Day process.







Show your tutor your notes on Word of the Week and receive a merit for answering the questions above!


