Dear Parents and Carers,

This week I want to share with you some national education news that relates to what we do here at Walkwood.

Firstly, the Ofsted Chief Inspector, Amanda Spielman, has spoken about the need for breadth in the school curriculum. She has said:

"Too many teachers and leaders have not been trained to think deeply about what they want their pupils to learn and how they are going to teach it. We saw curriculum narrowing, especially in upper key stage 2, with lessons disproportionately focused on English and mathematics. Sometimes, this manifested as intensive, even obsessive, test preparation for key stage 2 SATS."



Walkwood's Ofsted report noted that: "A varied and interesting curriculum gives pupils ample opportunities to study a broad range of subjects." This is because our school does think deeply about what is taught to pupils, and how we do it. English and Maths are central, but pupils have many subjects they experience. Our 'curriculum cake' shows that subject skills and knowledge are taught alongside Literacy and Numeracy. Lessons involve our Fruits of Faith and Superheroes too.

Also in the news was a school in Bradford which has placed importance on the Arts subjects, in particular Music. They too have a broad curriculum that

pupils follow, and their SATs results, like our own, have been improving year on year. The school's Headteacher, Naveed Idrees, says "What we discovered is that children need to be engaged not just at the level of the mind and body, but also the level of the soul." I couldn't agree more!



YouTube is a video sharing site/application that enables you to upload, view, rate, share and comment on a wide variety of videos. Consisting of a huge resource of information, advice and entertainment, YouTube now has 1.9 billion logged-in monthly users who watch a billion hours of video daily. Most of the content on Google-owned YouTube is uploaded by individuals, but organisations and media companies also offer some of their content via this platform.















What parents need to know about

SPENDING A PREMIUM

YouTube Premium (formerly YouTube Red) is a new paid streaming subscription service in the UK, offering a three-month free trial to tempt viewers into a £12-per-month plan. This includes the ability to download videos, stream videos with the app in the background, gives exclusive access to original content and a separate music streaming service and gaming app.

DANGEROUS 'CHALLENGE'
& VIRAL VIDEOS

On YouTube, 'challenge videos' are shared quickly and can be very dangerous. One person may post a video of themselves doing something unusual like eating a hot chilli or jumping in a river and before you know it, the video goes viral and everyone wants to join in and share their videos. The speed in which challenge videos spread across the Internet makes it difficult to keep up with the latest ones.

SHARING VIDEOS

As well as watching videos, many children are keen to share their own videos online, emulating their YouTube heroes, such as Stampy or DanTDM. However, if they post something on YouTube, they may later regret it or feel embarrassed about what they have shared. There is also a risk that they will receive hurtful or negative comments regarding not only their content, but also their appearance. YouTube's comment section is infamous for being one of the most opinionated on the Internet.

IN-APP MESSAGING

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When your child is logged into their Google account and browsing the YouTube website, they can share and talk about videos with their friends using the chat bubble. This can be found at the top right of the desktop site or through in-app messaging on their mobile or tablet. When they tap on the 'Friends' icon, they have a list of suggested people from their contacts – which can be any contact they've had on Google or somebody who has sent them an invite link

AGE-INAPPROPRIATE VIDEOS

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As YouTube is the biggest video sharing website in the world, there is content available for all ages, meaning that some content will not be appropriate for your child. If you think that content is unsuitable, there is a flagging feature to submit it for review by YouTube staff, but you will need to be aware that just because video is not appropriate for a younger audience, it may not violate YouTube's policies. YouTube has mechanisms in place to automatically remove explicit and harmful content, yet offensive content may still slip through.

TURN ON 'RESTRICTED' MODE

Restricted Mode' is an optional setting you can use to help screen out potentially mature content you may prefer your child not to see. Restricted Mode works on the browser or device level, so must be turned on for each browser or device your child uses. To do this, follow these steps:

- Desktop:
 Go to the bottom of any
 YouTube page and switch
 Restricted Mode to ON.
- To make it more difficult for this to be turned off, you will be given the option to lock restricted mode onto your browser.

Mobile:

- Mobile:

 Tap the three vertical dots at the top-right on the screen and press, 'Settings'.
 Click on'Restricted mode filtering.'
 Press 'Restrict.'

Please note that you can't'lock' restricted mode on a phone in the same way that you can on a desktop. You will need to turn this on each time your child uses it.

CREATE A FAMILY GOOGLE ACCOUNT

By having a shared family Google account, checking the history will enable you to see exactly what your child is watching and sharing on YouTube. To see the history on a computer, on the right hand menu under the library section, click 'History'. On mobiles, the viewing history can be found by clicking on the 'Library' tab.

When using YouTube, there may be instances where your child receives negative comments. If somebody's giving your child a difficult time, here's how to block them and prevent future comments and replies:

Go to their channel/account by clicking on their name.

Click on 'About'.

Tap the dropdown box with an image of a flag on it.

Press'Block user'.

DIGITAL WELLBEING

OPT FOR A FAMILY PREMIUM PLAN
A YouTube family Premium plan may be a cost-effective
option if you have more than one child. For £17.99 a month,
it allows you to share a YouTube paid membership with up to
five other family members – aged 13 and older – living in the
same household. As the account holder, or family manager,
you must create a Google family account.

MANAGING IN-APP MESSAGES

If your child is accessing YouTube via your account, bear in mind that they may be contacted by Google contacts who are complete strangers to them. You can remove someone from the suggested contacts list by pressing and holding the person's name and tapping on the red 'x.'

There are hundreds of YouTube accounts which show other people playing and commenting on games. These are called 'Let's Play' videos. While YouTube can be a great resource for hints, tips and news for games, it is a good idea for parents to keep a close eye on what YouTuber's are posting. Ski Trip 2020

Zauchensee, Salzberger Sportwelt, Austria



Following the success of this year's ski trip the school is planning a ski trip to Austria in 2020 and we would like to offer your child the opportunity to participate in this trip.

We are planning on returning to Zauchensee Ski Resort in Salzberger Sportwelt, Austria, travelling by executive coach and aeroplane departing on Saturday 8th February 2020 and returning on Saturday 15th February.

The Zauchensee Ski Resort is located within Austria's largest ski area, the Salzberger Sportwelt. With a combined piste of 345km and being a very snow sure resort, the Salzberger Sportwelt is an excellent resort for school groups.

Our accommodation in Zauchensee is a modern four star-premium hotel in the heart of the resort. Pupils will certainly be able to maximise their time on the slopes due to the outstanding location of the hotel, which is within a 200m walking distance to the ski lifts and nursery slopes. The hotel includes its own in house ski hire, TV/DVD Room, a recreation/games room with a football, table tennis, air hockey and pool table. Rooms are very comfortable, all en-suite, sleeping up to eight students with balconies overlooking the picturesque views of the surrounding slopes and mountains.

The cost of the trip is £1290 which includes:

Return flights and resort transfers

Coach transfer between school and airport

7 nights' accommodation on a Full Board Basis, including a hot two course lunch in the hotel

3 hot meals a day, including a 3-course dinner in the evening.

6-day lift-pass for all ski resorts in the Salzberger Sportwelt.

6-day hire of skis, boots, helmets and poles.

6 days of 4-hour ski tuition with qualified instructors at a ratio of 1:10 pupils.

A range of evening/après-ski activities such as swimming, bowling, games night and quiz.

Fully comprehensive travel insurance, which includes 24-hour medical assistance, ski loss or breakage, personal money and loss of travel documents.

The deadline for receipt of the first deposit is:

Friday 12th October 2018 - £150 representing a non-refundable deposit.

Information about further instalments will be issued upon offer of a place. The preferred method of payment is by Parent pay. A link to this is available via the Walkwood School Website.

If you are interested in your child taking part in this trip and they did not come home with a letter, then please ask them to come and see me for one.

Having been to this resort with Walkwood Church of England Middle School pupils on two previous ski trips, I am confident that the arrangements will give the students a tremendous week of skiing and a great experience in the Austrian mountains.
