Dear Parents and Carers,

The last of our sporting fixtures have been taking place, with just a couple of matches next week. This afternoon has over seventy pupils competing at the athletics event at the Abbey Stadium, having gained sufficient times or distances to represent our school at this district event. This is the highest number of Walkwood competitors that we can recall. It certainly ends a hugely successful year of sport, across a wide range of different activities and age groups. Thank you to those of you who have allowed your children to compete, especially if it has meant you have collected them at a time other than the end of the school day. Also, my thanks go to the staff who have organised and trained the pupils throughout the year. The Sports Award assembly in the week after next will bring all this together.

I was with some Year 8 pupils at St. Augustine's yesterday as we attended an afternoon of activities around modern foreign languages. The pupils took to the tasks really well and their thinking was strong. Of course, next week will see all our Year 8 pupils go to their respective high schools. Walkwood staff have worked with teachers in the high schools to make the process of moving schools as smooth as possible. There will be anxieties, of course, but pupils have told me they are ready to make the next step in their education.

Naturally, with the Year 8s not in school, we shall welcome a new year group of Year 4 pupils. Our teachers have been to the first schools to make contact with teachers, and some pupils have already made an initial visit to ease any worries. You may recall how you felt as a parent or carer when you dropped off your child to us for the first time, and that the greater worry was yours rather than the pupil's! We have two very full days for the incoming pupils (they're likely to sleep well having been rather tired out, if for no other reason than the regular moving around the school). We shall also allow the new youngsters to know we are a Church of England school, respecting the beliefs of all and celebrating our inclusiveness.

Pupils make good progress

during their time at school. A well-taught and broad curriculum ensures that most pupils work at or above age-related expectations.



That is one of the sentences in the Ofsted report for our school. Behind it is something rather brave - here at Walk wood we do train pupils to complete their SATs, but rather we look for them to have a wide range of subjects through out their time with us.

Of course, that does not mean we ignore SATs. We prepare pupils through their English and Mathematics lessons, and change only a few times in order to ensure pupils do not get stressed. The children have other subjects that use different skills, so they have variety during the day. This is a benefit from a middle school that has its pupils moving around the building.



In the coming weeks, pupils in all years will take some assessments. These are matched against other pupils of the same year group across the country. The **ssessment** tests allow us to know how much progress that our pupils are making.

It is because of these assessments that we know that around 85% of Walkwood pupils leave our school working at standards that are above their age in English and Mathematics.

Please remember that it is not just about 'the results' for pupils. Even at GCSE and above, it is about how students think, behave and respond. Ofsted said:

"Many teachers balance the development of pupils' subject knowledge, skills for learning and positive attitudes very skilfully. They blend the lesson objectives with the development of 'superhero learning traits' and promote pupils' understanding of the 'fruits of faith'."

They finished by saying:

"During their time at school, pupils develop into confident, hardworking and articulate pupils. They acquire good social skills, develop tolerance of others and are resilient."


