Dear Parents and Carers,

Unlike some supermarkets, the Christmas decorations only went up this week! Advent (the season of preparation before Christmas) officially began last Sunday, although those who have an Advent calendar would have started on Friday, I suspect. The colour for Advent is purple, to show we are preparing for an event.

At school, we have our own Advent calendar, where some of our Year 5 pupils come down each day when they do not have assembly. We open up a window as it tells the Christmas story, and have a prayer before sharing some chocolate.

Walkwood's choir attended an event at The Bridge Memorial Hall where they sang carols for the assembled senior citizens and carers. Some of the group were singing along with the pupils! We shall have our own assembly that recalls some classic carols in the coming week.

At the start of this week our thoughts and prayers were with the secondary school in Essex where a pupil lost his life, and others were injured, in a hit-and-run. Safety on the roads is so important in and around schools. Many of you are aware that I support our pupils in crossing Feckenham Road just in front of our main gate, while other staff are in positions in the environs. We do this to ensure our pupils are safe. However, barely a week goes by when I experience a 'near miss' as I walk onto the crossing, even when I am wearing a hi-viz jacket (with matching umbrella when it is raining!). The parking enforcement officers have been making random visits along Feckenham Road, Tennyson Road and Swinburne Road.

Finally, I draw your attention to our festive arrangements for the last week of term - lunches for Wednesday and Thursday (payment through ParentPay, selecting the Christmas lunch option) and the festive jumpers where we shall collect donations towards Children in Need.



Christmas Lunch 2019

Christmas lunches this year will be held on Wednesday 18th and Thursday 19th December 2019. If your child wishes to have a Christmas lunch, the cost will be £3.50, to be paid via Parentpay.

Abberley and Malvern Colleges will have their Christmas lunches on Wednesday 18th December, while Bredon and Cleeve College lunches will be on the following day. There will be no other catering availa-

ble on these days, so pupils who do not wish to have a Christmas lunch will need to bring in a packed meal from home; equally the children in the colleges not having Christmas lunch will need to bring in a packed lunch as no other meals will be available. Those who take free school lunches will be provided with their meal (a Christmas meal on their allocated College day and a packed lunch on the other day).

Please note that when paying by Parentpay, the Christmas lunch option will be listed as a separate item so that we can identify the number of meals required. Please select the Christmas lunch item (log in to Parentpay, then go into 'pay for other items') and ensure that you make your payment by 15th December 2019. If you are unable to pay by Parentpay, please put £3.50 in an envelope clearly marked with your child's name and tutor group and put it in the drop box. Please ensure that your child does not put their £3.50 in the cashloader as this method is only to be used for everyday school meals.

Please note, **no tuck** will be available on Wednesday 18th & Thursday 19th December.

This week's Word of the Week:




