Check if you or your child has coronavirus symptoms

Track and trace

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.



Pupil Leadership Team 2021-2022













Think before you park!


Illegal and irresponsible parking can put lives in danger. Remember the following:



No parking or waiting at any time.



Parking at restricted times only.



Parking on footpaths/corners/junctions creates a dangerous obstruction to pedestrians and other drivers.

If you choose to ignore this advice you may be prosecuted.

The safety of pedestrians is far more important than finding a close spot to leave your car. Always think before you park.



How to Set up



ARENTAL CONTROLS

Android Phone



The settings on an Android device allow you to set certain rules to help safeguard your child's privacy when they are using it.

For example, you can turn off location services to keep their whereabouts private; prevent third-party apps and sites from viewing their information; and stop apps from accessing other functions of the phone (like the camera or microphone, for example). We've produced step-by-step guides on how to tighten up an Android phone's privacy settings.





Select your child's account

On the 'Settings' card, tap

How to control access for third-party apps and sites


Sign in to your Google Families account

Under 'Members', select your child's name

Select 'Account info' and then 'More'

Select 'Third-party apps with account access'

Turn 'Allow third-party apps to access XX account' to off by toggling the switch



Open the Google Family Link app

Select your child's account

On the 'Device' card, tap 'Settings

Tap 'App permissions' then choose a permission

Below your child's device, switch the permission off

Alternatively, you can manage permissions for individual apps. Repeat steps I and 2, then ...

On the 'Allowed' list, tap the app you want to change the permissions for

Tap 'App permissions'

 γ Switch the permission off

Tap 'Location'

'Manage'

On the card with the correct device's name, tap 'Settings'

Turn 'Device location' to off

To reactivate location services in future, repeat these steps and turn 'Device location' back on




The privacy settings on your child's Apple device give you control over the information stored on it. This allows you to select which apps can access features and information on your child's device: for example, you might wish to block a social networking app from connecting to the camera reel, or specify which apps can use the device's location data.




How to make changes to privacy settings





You can block certain apps from obtaining information from your child's device. You can also prevent your child (or anyone other than you) from altering these settings.





Create a possecode that will be required to allow for more time, or to make changes to screen Time ettings.




