It has been a pleasure over the last two weeks to have so many of you in school for the two Parents' Evenings. 

#### Reading matters



DICTIONARY

Did you know that your child's daily reading at home will help them to make maximum progress not only in the subject of reading/English, but all across all subjects? Please do keep reminding your child to read at home each day for a minimum of twenty minutes, in order to help them prosper across the full curriculum. Hearing your child read aloud is also useful for pupils of all ages and abilities in reading.





Each week, there is a word displayed here. If the pupils have a go at the tasks below linked to the weekly word, they will earn a point from their tutor. Once per fortnight the tutor will go through the previous two weeks' words and pupils will work collaboratively exploring their meanings, features and usage.



- 1. What word class is this word? Could it belong to more than one word class?
- 2. How many syllables does it have?
- 3. Write the dictionary definition(s) of this word, using your own words.
- 4. What are the synonyms for the word?
- 5. What are the antonyms for the word?
- 6. Write four sentences, each containing the word.

Vary the type of sentence each time: write one as a statement; one as a question; one as a command and one as an exclamation sentence.

For example, if the Word of the Week were exhilarated:

**Statement:** Sam is feeling exhilarated this morning.
