Dear Parents / Guardians

This week is Operation Sceptre - the national anti-knife crime intensification week. We know early intervention is vital when tackling knife crime. As part of this week, I would like to take this opportunity to make you aware of a recent concern highlighted to the police.

It has come to Police attention that some online Retailers are selling items in their 'back to school' sections which are not suitable for young persons. An item recently highlighted was seemingly a metal writing pen but concealed inside was a knife with a blade of approximately 3 inches in length. The item could be easily purchased online and for less than £5.

This is a reminder to all Parents/ Guardians to have conversations with your young people to re-iterate the danger and criminality of carrying knives and knife crime and the devastating impact it can have.

Christmas Lunch 2023

Christmas lunches this year will be held on Tuesday 19th and Wednesday 20th December 2023. If your child wishes to have a Christmas lunch, the cost will be £4.00, to be paid via Parentpay.

Abberley and **Cleeve** Colleges will have their Christmas lunches on Tuesday 19th December, while **Bredon** and **Malvern** College lunches will be on the following day. **There will be no other catering available on these days**, so pupils who do not wish to have a Christmas lunch will need to bring in a packed meal from home; equally the children in the colleges not having Christmas lunch will need to bring in a packed lunch as no other meals will be available. Those who take free school lunches will be provided with their meal (a Christmas meal on their allocated College day and a packed lunch on the other day).

Please note that when paying by Parentpay, the Christmas lunch option will be listed as a separate item so that we can identify the number of meals required. Please select the Christmas lunch item (log in to Parentpay, then go into 'pay for other items') and ensure that you make your payment by 15th December 2023.

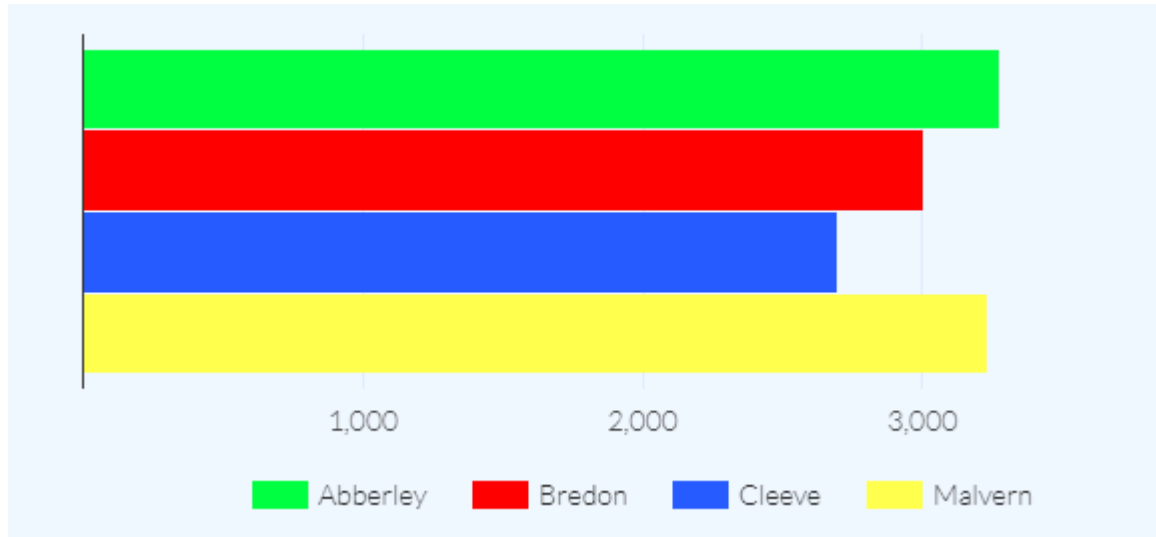

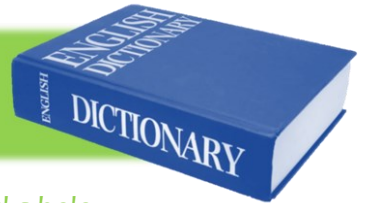
Reading matters



Did you know that reading supports cognitive development and impacts positively across the whole curriculum? Readers are likely to do 'significantly better' in all subjects, with a 9.9% advantage in Maths alone. (IoE, 2013). With this in mind, please remember that we expect our students to read daily for between 20 and 30 minutes. Some of that reading will need to be done outside of school. Pupils will benefit from reading aloud daily to an adult (even if for a short time), right the way up to year 8 and is not just an exercise useful to younger children.



Word of the Week



Each week, there is a word displayed here. If the pupils have a go at the tasks below linked to the weekly word, they will earn a point from their tutor. Once per fortnight the tutor will go through the previous two weeks' words and pupils will work collaboratively exploring their meanings, features and usage.
