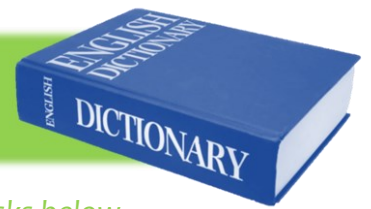

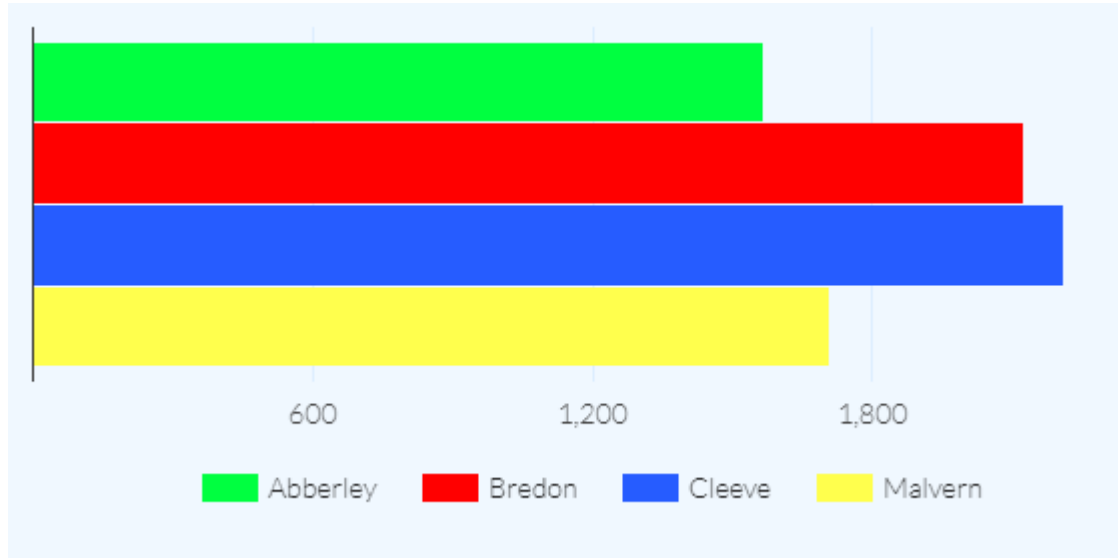

As Harvest is fast approaching, we as a school are collecting non-perishable food items and toiletries to be donated to local food banks.

There is an area in our foyer area for any donations. We are asking pupils to bring in the following:

- Abberley - tinned vegetables, tinned fish, tinned meat or tinned soups

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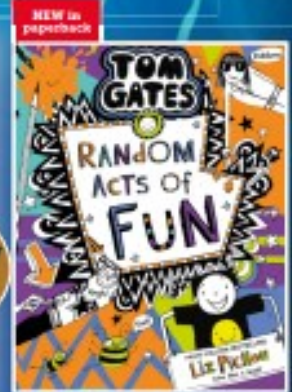

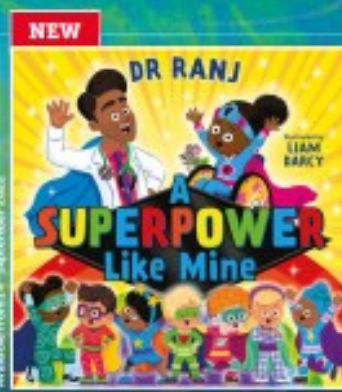

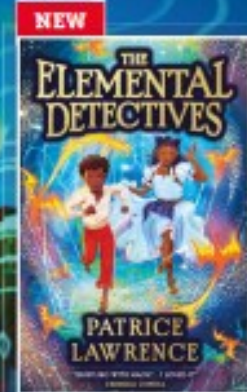
