The excellent work that takes place within the first school to allow children to learn about how to be safe on pavements is demonstrable by how they are on the way to and from school. That also applies to Walkwood pupils too. In fact, the reason that Walkwood

staff are on duty outside the school is to extend our care for our pupils' safety. We do ask, however, that if you are using a car near the two schools, that you drive slowly during the times when children are arriving at, or departing from, school, and park considerately. Don't forget that Morton Stanley Park is a possible drop off point for children at Walkwood.

We are able to offer feedback to you as parents and carers later this half term. There are Parent and Carer Consultation Evenings coming up for Year 6 and 8 on Thursday 30th January and Wednesday 5th February. Appointment times to meet the teachers are to be booked electronically. Reports for the other year groups will be prepared for sending out in the week before half term.






