Dear Parents and Carers,

This week noted a key item that indicates that pupils are settled into routine - no-one appeared to a lesson late because they had lost their way. One pupil told me that it was easier now that they realised that the two sets of stairs in the main block went up to different subjects. Progress indeed. We also had our formal fire drill that worked really well, and better from the practice that occurred last week.



Mrs Laishley and I have led pupils in our first hymns assemblies. She is the person who knows about the musical elements, while I can explain the meaning of words or phrases. Our school anthem, "Bless the Lord O my soul" (also known as *Ten Thousand Reasons*), was sung well by all colleges, particularly as the element of the crescendo within the chorus was a new item.

We are very aware of the financial pressures that many families find themselves in, issues that affect the running of the school too. The cost of residential visits has risen alarmingly and it has felt unreasonable to continue with the provision that in past years has seemed appropriate. Therefore, we shall be offering two residential visits, one for Year 5 and another for Year 7, while Years 6 and 8 have the opportunity for



day trips during school time. As with any residential, there are limits on the numbers of pupils we can accommodate, while also being aware that the travel distance to the host venue must be sensible for the age of pupils.

A reminder that if pupils bring mobile phones into school, these **must** be handed in to the tutor in the morning. The devices are put in the 'phone boxes' and taken to our Reception office for the day and are collected at the day's end. No exceptions to this arrangement will be permitted.

Exclamation:	what a joyous evening!






Feckenham Road has been supervised at key points this week by Police and Traffic Enforcement Officers.


