Teaching, Learning & Curriculum

Main Purpose

The committee of the Governing Body shall

- needs to take a strategic role in setting the curriculum and ensuring that the standards of teaching and learning are high;
- to monitor all aspects of teaching and learning.

Terms of reference

- To consider and advise the Governing Body on standards and other matters relating to the school's curriculum, including statutory requirements and the School's Curriculum Policy.
- To evaluate School Development Plan priorities relating to teaching, learning and the curriculum
- To consider curricular issues which have implications for finance and to make recommendations to the relevant committee or the Governing Body.
- To make arrangements for the Governing Body to be represented at School Improvement discussions with the Regional Schools Commissioner and for reports to be received by the Governing Body.
- To review data regarding pupils' performance, using both external and internal information, including reference to specific groups of pupils compared to the cohort as a whole.
- To consider reports from external reviewers about curricular provision and the standards of teaching and learning.
- To scrutinise information regarding the quality of teaching and learning, gathered from monitoring carried out within the school.
- To receive Governor Visit reports on subject areas within the curriculum.
- To oversee arrangements for educational visits.
- To keep under review the management and structure of the school day.
- To review the Relationships and Sex Education policy annually.
- To amend and approve policies that encompass the areas of teaching, learning and the curriculum.

Quorum
