Dear Parents and Carers,

We had an unannounced inspection from Environmental Health on Tuesday to reassess our catering facilities and procedures. Once again, Walkwood has gained a 5-star rating for its food preparation equipment and practices, including consideration for labelling and how we take account of allergies. Consequently, we congratulate Mrs Williams who leads the kitchen staff, and the catering team of Mrs Evans, Mrs Ellis and Mrs Tither.

Today has seen the visit of the nursing team to administer the nasal flu vaccine to those from whom we have received consent. As for the HPV that took place for Year 8 last month and for any vaccinations that take place on our site, the school simply provides a venue for the health practitioners who take responsibility for the administration of the vaccines.

Emails have been sent this week for the residential visits that are taking place in 2022. A payment plan applies for each and, should the need arise, we offer to talk with anyone if this does not fit into when they are paid. We have deadlines for payment to our suppliers, so it is important that sufficient funds are available. Interest for the ski trip in 2023 does not close until just before half term.





On the final day of this half term, Thursday 21st October, we shall be holding a charity fundraising event. Our intention is to supply the local food bank as well as an international charity. For the latter we hope to raise sufficient to send a dairy cow to a village in a less economically developed nation through Send-a-Cow. Therefore, on this day, we offer pupils the opportunity to dress in black and white and bring in £1 and a tin of food of some kind, with soups, canned fruit, vegetables or meat preferred. How does it work?

Attendance Points Boosters

- A 5-point booster will be awarded for every time your child has 100% Attendance for the period of the 2-week timetable- Week 1 & Week 2.
- These points are automatically given out on the Friday of Week 2.

Zero Demerit Points Boosters

A reward for all pupils who continue to demonstrate excellent focus and behaviour in and out of lessons.

- We are awarding a 5-point booster for every time your child has Zero Demerits during the period of the 2-week timetable- Week 1 & Week 2.
- Again, these booster points are automatically given out on the Friday of Week 2.



New household account feature for parents reporting test results

NHS Test and Trace are continuing to develop and improve the process for self-test reporting. Currently, if a parent is submitting results through their account on behalf of a child, they have to enter the child's details every time they report a result.

As a result of feedback from parents, NHS Test and Trace have introduced household accounts. This allows parents to save their children's details to their own user accounts so parents can report results for multiple members in the household more quickly and easily.


When reporting self-test results parents will now be offered the opportunity to create a household account, which should take no more than 2 minutes. Parents can then add all household members to their account, enabling them to save time when reporting all future self-test results.
