Dear Parents and Carers,

There have been challenges to overcome this week across the country and I hope these were not duly difficult for you. We have looked to ensure our regular routines and expectations have been impacted as little as possible.

At Walkwood, we continue to be committed to the education of the whole child, looking for pupils to love to learn the content of the curriculum, to learn to live through the **Superhero** learning skills and also to learn to love through the outworking of our **Fruits of Faith**. The academic progress our pupils make through the four years here is excellent, with over three-quarters of pupils achieving beyond their age expectations by the time they leave us. Unlike some primary schools, we do not put our Year 6 pupils through an unrelenting diet of English and Maths, but allow a balanced curriculum. The SATs will come around again, and we shall do all we can to keep matters low key so that the pupils do not feel too pressured. Year 8 are a few weeks away from hearing which high school they have been allocated. However, the memory of Walkwood will be with them, as it is with so many who have left us in years gone by.

On Monday 13th February, author of the very popular *Ultimate Football Series* books,


Matt Oldfield, will join us in school for the day. He will present to each of the four year groups in turn and take their questions during a discussion time at the end of each lesson.



Pupils and staff alike are very much looking forward to this special visit!





Tips for Encouraging Open Discussions about

people, far more so than for previous generations. There are many positives to children being able to access online materials, so it's important not to demonise the internet, games and apps, and limit the benefit of their positive aspects. At the same time, we do have a responsibility to educate children about the hazards they may encounter online (just as we would about real-world dangers) so it's essential that we don't shy away from talking to them about the complex – and often sensitive – subject of what they do and what they see when they're online.

Here are some suggestions for kicking off conversations with your child about their digital life ...

MAKE YOUR INTEREST

BE OPEN AND HONEST, APPROPRIATE TO THEIR AGE

REMIND YOUR CHILD THEY CAN ALWAYS TALK TO YOU

in my role I work with many children and young people who admit being reluctant to tell a trusted adult about harmful content they've viewed online, in case it leads to having their devices confiscated. Emphasise to your child that you're always there to listen and help; reassure them that if they do view harmful content, then they are not to blame – but talking about it openly will help. Children shouldn't be expected to be resilient against abuse or feel that it's their job to




