Dear Parents and Carers,

The two transition days have dominated this week. Our new Year 5s spent Wednesday and Thursday at Walkwood, familiarising themselves with the school and many of our routines. The morning of the first day was mostly spent in tutor groups so that the older children could get to know the new pupils, and vice versa. Tutors had prepared activities to get to know pupils, including material that would allow those who were already here to reflect on their time thus far. We had our new tutors with us for the first day at least, and we are grateful to the schools they are leaving that they could allow a day's absence.

DICTIONARY

This week, parents and carers have been emailed about access to digital books, through the platform of myON. For this summer holiday only, pupils can login to <u>www.myon.co.uk</u>, using the login details emailed earlier this week. myON will give pupils access to their digital library of 9,263 books over the summer holiday! Access is free, temporary and not compulsory, although we hope that our learners will enjoy reading online books over the summer and to continue reading for empowerment!





Each week, there is a word displayed here. If the pupils have a go at the tasks below linked to the weekly word, they will earn a point from their tutor. Once per fortnight the tutor will go through the previous two weeks' words and pupils will work collaboratively exploring their meanings, features and usage.
