Dear Parents and Carers,

This week we have launched 'Takeover Day', the first time we have been able to reintroduce this Walkwood tradition since the pandemic. Pupils have the opportunity to apply for jobs of people who work in school. The jobs may not be those that they would want to do after they have finished compulsory schooling, but pupils may be interested to know what a job involves. It is, in effect, an extension of the careers education we cover in school. Pupils need to apply for the posts available, just like they will need to apply for jobs in the future, and information to support with their letters of application has been posted on ePraise to all year groups.





The preparation for the residentials of this year are underway. The information evening for Year 5 took place on Wednesday, and thank you to all those who attended. The process of filling out the form is now open, so please do not delay. Many of Year 6 will be going to Blackwell Adventure for the day after half term, this being spilt into three

visits with two classes each time because our original plan went astray after the announcement of the change in SATs dates.

We wish our standards of uniform to be maintained through this term. We know just how many jumpers get left in the playground and then 'lost', although we have a number of items still. If a piece of clothing has a name in, it helps us greatly. Also, as the weather gets warmer, we do urge pupils to bring their water bottles to school. That said, we amass around a dozen bottles each week that are left around the site, and these are placed by the in-school post box for pupils to collect.





Finally, you may be aware that all four education unions are balloting members in connection with strike action. The greatest concern is that pay rises are not funded by the government, and thus schools are placed into making difficult decisions. Walkwood is having to make such choices now, although the future of education for our children should not be something that is underfunded.




Looking After Your WELLBEING ONLINE


