## Reading matters



DICTIONARY

At Walkwood, we prioritise reading for empowerment. We teach pupils about how important reading is to them not only now, but also to their future selves, as the ability to read is such a strong indicator of success in later life. We remind pupils to strive to read for 20-30 minutes each day. During the previous academic year, our pupils read over 110 million words, with over 7,500 books being quizzed on! Keep up the super reading, Walkwood!





Each week, there is a word displayed here. If the pupils have a go at the tasks below linked to the weekly word, they will earn a point from their tutor. Once per fortnight the tutor will go through the previous two weeks' words and pupils will work collaboratively exploring their meanings, features and usage.



- 1. What word class is this word? Could it belong to more than one word class?
- 2. How many syllables does it have?
- 3. Write the dictionary definition(s) of this word, using your own words.
- 4. What are the synonyms for the word?
- 5. What are the antonyms for the word?
- 6. Write four sentences, each containing the word.

Vary the type of sentence each time: write one as a statement; one as a question; one as a command and one as an exclamation sentence.

For example, if the Word of the Week were exhilarated:

**Statement:** Sam is feeling exhilarated this morning.
