

Reading Matters

Thank you so much to all of you who dressed up for World Book Day to celebrate our love of literature, both contemporary and classic! Pupils from all year groups made a huge effort with this and we were delighted with the creativity which took place with costumes.

This week during our Monday worship, Mrs Johnson spoke to the school about the importance of daily reading and about our school reading motto: Reading for empowerment. Several children from across the school recommended their favourite book and all pupils were reminded of the importance of daily reading for 20 minutes, outside of school time.

Why should I read?



- Research shows that reading fiction is associated with higher levels of empathy and improved relationships with others
- Reading silently for just 6 minutes slows down the heart rate and eases tension in the muscles, reducing stress levels to a point lower than when the stress set in
