Dear Parents and Carers,

I suspect you will have read my <u>email message</u> yesterday in relation to the surge testing that is taking place in our town after the small number of cases of the South African variant of Covid-19. I have been in contact with colleagues within the local public health team, and have been amazed at the complexity of the work they are carrying out on our behalf. The intention has been that Walkwood supports the efforts within the community, and the test kit drop box is already affixed just inside our gate. Please see inside for the latest information about test kit distributions.

As restrictions nationally are reduced from Monday, the situation within schools remains robustly focused on prevention and, if needed, containment. Although much has been made of the easing of constraints on what we can do, the system of controls within schools has hardly changed. The main news item was around the wearing of masks. However, that will not apply at our school, for in agreement with the local health team, we shall continue the wearing of masks for the next two weeks. This is in accordance with the Department for Education's current guidance; "of face coverings for pupils, students or staff may be advised for a temporary period in response to particular localised outbreaks, including variants of concern".



We have been contending with the rain this week. I have been left wondering if the 'April showers' are running somewhat late. The pupils have been resilient, even if we are having to move from the play-ground back inside due to yet another downpour!

Thursday brought the end of Ramadan, which is celebrated in the festival of Eid al Fitr. After fasting during the days of Ramadan which brings Allah's followers closer to Him, family and friends come together at Eid to give thanks for Allah's blessings through prayer and community. Although this is a day after the Eid, may all your good deeds be accepted by God - Atamanna lakum Eid sa'id jiddan! Litakun kul a'malakum al-khayyira maqbula 'ind Allah.

Covid test kits

Lateral flow

The lateral flow devices, which are being used by some pupils in Years 7 and 8, will be replenished on Monday as we send a new batch of the kit boxes home with pupils. All boxes should arrive at home with the seals intact.

Surge testing

As part of the town's surge testing efforts, Walkwood is working with public health to distribute PCR kits and facilitate their collection. Children can be tested at the discretion of parents and carers. To give permission for your child to be receive a test kit, you can complete <u>this form</u>.

These kits will be sent home on either Tuesday or Wednesday, depending on when they reach us. Completed tests can be dropped into the white collection box that is just inside the front gate.

This week's Word of the Week:






Check if you or your child has coronavirus symptoms

Track and trace

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.
