Cross Country Amendments

Pupils have unrestricted access to this site and are actively encouraged to visit the webpage or download the app to access the games frequently. (They will be able to locate vocabulary linked to topics being studied in class.) Little and often is a great way to learn languages. French is the language taught at Walkwood but we always encourage students to widen their horizons. Should pupils with inquisitive minds wish to explore another language, they are welcome to use this website for personal development.

Year 5 are recommended to access the Elementary section.

Year 6's learning content will be a mix of topics available on the Elementary and Beginner sections.

KS3 will predominantly utilise the Beginner and Intermediate sections, but may wish to recap the basics by accessing the Elementary section.

Here is how the initial page will appear. Select the Flag for the language you wish to learn.



Top tip: If you are uncertain about how to use a section / game within the website, play it once in English to understand the process and then revert to the French section.
