The Governing Body recognises the valuable contribution that the wide range of additional activities can make towards a student's all-round educational experience and their personal and social development.

Charging

For any activities where charges can be made, the Academy will levy such charges.

For any activities where charges cannot formally be levied, the Academy will ask for, "voluntary contributions". The Principal will have the delegated authority to determine whether any such activity will continue, dependent upon the level of financial response from parents. Parents will be invited to make a voluntary contribution for transport, entrance fees or other charges in connection with an educational visit. No child will be excluded from any activities requiring voluntary contributions that do take place through failure to make such a contribution.

Please note, however, that any child can be excluded from such activities as part of our Academy disciplinary procedures.

Charging in kind

From time to time parents are asked to contribute to the cost of certain craft activities and letters of explanation are sent home at the appropriate time.

Charging for music tuition, photocopying and private telephone calls are charged at cost price.

Any insurance costs will be included in charges made for trips and activities.

Remissions

The Governing Body may remit charges in full or in part to parents after considering specific hardship cases. The Governing Body invites parents to apply, in strictest confidence, for the remission of charges directly to the Principal. The Principal has delegated authority to determine whether a bursary shall be given.

Subsidies from various sources, e.g., School Fund, will be considered to help towards the cost of activities for pupils who are unable to pay the full amount. This would take the form of a bursary and can only be offered if funds are available.

Subsidies from various sources, e.g., School Fund, will be considered to cover deficits should funds be available.

Pupil Premium is distributed as per Government guidelines and is published annually on the Academy's website.
