Dear Parents and Carers,

The weather has certainly changed this week, and I was heartened by the number of coats that were evident in the mornings. It does amuse me when I see a pupil carrying a coat over their arm, which tends to happen at the end of a school day, especially when it is raining. However, we do try and ensure that pupils can go out to play as much as we can throughout the school year.





I am pre-empting the usual clamour when the SATs results are finally published, although the election may make more noise in the news. The tests that pupils sit in May of Year 6 produce outcomes that are not easy to apply when we are in a three-tier system. In fact, middle schools have Year 6 pupils for only five terms. Fortunately, Walkwood has a broad and balanced curriculum, which means that pupils are not being trained to do the tests, and this view has been tak-

en by the current Chief Inspector of Schools. In fact, Ofsted say:

There are some schools that start and stop at non-standard ages for pupils, so we take into account national expectations differently.

And it continues: Pupils at middle schools, on average, have lower progress scores at the end of key stage 2 than pupils at primary schools. Due to the age range of pupils at middle schools, pupils will have only attended a middle school for a short time before they take their key stage 2 tests and will still have a number of years left at the school. Inspectors will take this into account...

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At Walkwood, our pupils make excellent progress throughout the four years they are here, with on average, 75% of pupils exceeding age-related expectations in reading, writing and maths by the end of Year 8. Do bear this in mind when SATs get into the news.



Our theme this week has been 'temptation' or rather, avoiding it! Our Fruits of Faith expect pupils to have thoughts and actions that show honour, honesty, friendliness and forgiveness. Naturally, children are children so expectations are not always met, but life is learning!

Christmas Lunch 2019

Christmas lunches this year will be held on Wednesday 18th and Thursday 19th December 2019. If your child wishes to have a Christmas lunch, the cost will be £3.50, to be paid via Parentpay.

Abberley and Malvern Colleges will have their Christmas lunches on Wednesday 18th December, while Bredon and Cleeve College lunches will be on the following day. There will be no other catering available on these days, so pupils who do not wish to have a Christmas lunch will need to bring in a packed meal from home; equally the children in the colleges not having Christmas lunch will need to bring in a packed lunch as no other meals will be available. Those who take free school lunches will be provided with their meal (a Christmas meal on their allocated College day and a packed lunch on the other day). Please note that when paying by Parentpay, the Christmas lunch option will be listed as a separate item so that we can identify the number of meals required. Please select the Christmas lunch item (log in to Parentpay, then go into 'pay for other items') and ensure that you make your payment by 15th December 2019. If you are unable to pay by Parentpay, please put £3.50 in an envelope clearly marked with your child's name and tutor group and put it in the drop box. Please ensure that your child does not put their £3.50 in the cashloader as this method is only to be used for everyday school meals.

Please note, no tuck will be available on Wednesday 18th & Thursday 19th December.

Rummaging in the loft, contacting family members and friends asking for warm clothing, blankets and anything else they could spare in order to provide warmth to people sleeping on the streets.






